

HEALTH RULES

CATTLE HEALTH RULES

1. 2020 Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued with 60 days of the event is required. Department superintendents are responsible for checking all health certificates and have the final judgement in resolving any dispute.
2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI (a statement of this is printed on the CVI). Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.
3. Individual official animal identification is required. Official ID ear tag or other unique identification device approved by PDA. A USDA-issued National Uniform Ear tagging system (NUES) tag having a US Shield "840"; or a 15-digit animal identification number ear tag starting with "840" (including RFID); or other official identification approved by PDA. (Brands and breed registration with tattoos are not acceptable).
4. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed Veterinarian is required for animals 3 months of age and older (market cattle are exempt from this vaccination requirement).
5. All vaccine label directions must be followed, and all rabies vaccinated cattle must be accompanied by a rabies vaccination certificate or the vaccination information must be included on the CVI. If a rabies vaccination certificate is provided, the certificate must contain legible name and contact information of the veterinarian who administered the vaccine and the veterinarian's signature. A copy of the rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable.

SHEEP HEALTH RULES

1. 2020 certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI) issued with 60 days.
2. Department superintendents are responsible for checking all paper work and have the final judgement in resolving any dispute.
3. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI (this statement if pre-printed on the CVI). Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.
4. Individual official animal identification is required for all sheep. Official ID includes:
 - *A USDA ear tag with a US shield; or
 - *A legible tattoo with herd and individual identification recognized in an approved USDA Scrapie database a.k.a. a scrapie tattoo (only for flocks enrolled in the USDA Voluntary Scrapie Flock Certification Program); or
 - * A breed registration tattoo if the animals are accompanied by a registration certificate (copy acceptable) and the tattoo is legible.
5. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is required for animals 3 months of age and older (market sheep are exempt from this vaccination requirement). All vaccine label directions must be followed, and all rabies vaccinated sheep must be accompanied by a rabies vaccination certificate or the vaccination information must be included on the CVI. If a rabies vaccination certificate is provided, the certificate must contain legible name and contact information of the veterinarian who administered the vaccine and the veterinarian's signature. A copy of the vaccination certificate is acceptable

SWINE HEALTH RULES

- 1. 2020 Certificate of Veterinary Inspection within 14 days.**
- 2. Department superintendents are responsible for checking all required health certificates and have the final judgement in resolving any dispute.**
- 3. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI (a statement of this is printed on the CVI). Tag number must be recorded on the CVI.**
- 4. Individual animal ID is required. ID options include the following: A form of official PDA ID including: A registration certificate in combination with an ear notch; or a USDA issued metal ear tag with a US shield; or an ISO compliant 15 digit ear tag starting with "840" (including RFID); and a plastic stamped ear tag (market hogs only).**

GOAT HEALTH RULES

- 1. The date to be used for computing all health regulation ages and deadlines is the date of Wednesday, August 19, 2020.**
- 2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI (a statement of this is printed on the CVI).**
- 3. 2020 Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within 60 days of the event.**
- 4. Individual official animal identification is required for all goats. Official ID includes:**
 - *A USDA ear tag with a US shield or;**
 - * A legible tattoo with herd and individual identification (recognized in an approved USDA Scrapie database a.k.a. A scrapie tattoo (only for herds enrolled in the USDA Voluntary Scrapie Herd Certification Program); or**
 - *A breed registration tattoo if the animals are accompanied by a registration certificate and the tattoo is legible.**

RABBITS

- 1. A 2020 CVI issued within 60 days of the event.**
- 2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases. Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.**
- 3. Department superintendents are responsible for checking all required health certificates and have the final judgement in resolving any dispute.**
